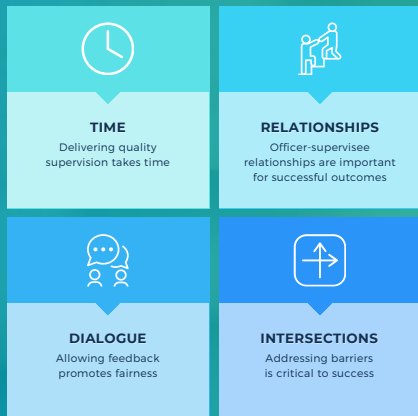
Our work

Community Supervision

Community supervision, including probation and parole, is a pivotal component of the criminal justice system that offers an alternative to traditional incarceration, allowing individuals to serve their sentences in the community while adhering to specified conditions and supervision.

DCS embraces a **Person-Centered approach** to supervision that promotes success by recognizing people as unique individuals with distinct strengths, circumstances, needs, and goals. Our Person-Centered Supervision Model is based on four main principles:



This model enables us to provide individuals with resources and opportunities to ensure personal growth and support their transition into law-abiding and productive community members.

Reentry Services

Partnerships with community providers, recovery organizations, law enforcement agencies, and stakeholders enable us to provide resources, tools, support, and opportunities to each individual under supervision, ensuring a successful reintegration into the community.

The person's overall well-being is taken into account, acknowledging that factors such as housing, employment, family support, and community connections play a significant role in their successful reintegration. Efforts are made to address these needs and provide appropriate referrals and support networks.

Day Reporting Centers

DRCs provide select individuals the opportunity to change criminal thinking and behavior through the delivery of structured interventions and support. Intensive services target substance abuse, mental health, and/or cognitive/ behavioral issues through counseling, education, and close supervision.
